At the Double Tree Westminster, was our Woman of the Year Dinner. The keynote speaker was last year's awardee, Jill Fellman, and we honored Mary Ross, our new Woman of the Year. In addition, the evening celebrated BPW NW Metro's 60th anniversary. I would like to take this opportunity to thank BPW NW Metro for the plaque I received – HONORED MEMBER OF THE YEAR.

AUGUST, 2016

Our annual BBQ/potluck where we gathered for a brief business meeting and caught up on visiting.

Evie Hudak was our host and we viewed the documentary, *Strong Sisters*, produced by Meg Froelich and Laura Hoeppner. This documentary is on women and Colorado politics. More than 60 women were interviewed for the project. In 1893 Colorado gave women the right to vote, the first time in history that women's suffrage was granted through a popular vote. The very next year voters sent three women to the state House of Representatives — the first women anywhere in the world elected to a parliamentary body. Now, 41 percent of state lawmakers in Colorado are women. The state has led the nation in the percentage of women lawmakers for more than a decade.

Highlights from her August Legislative Committee report:

- (1.) Great progress for Cities for CEDAW (Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women) action with a letter that was drafted and approved. This letter goes briefly over history of CEDAW and why we are now doing Cities for CEDAW, with dates and information to help any city understand why we are asking them to sign on with us. A letter was sent to the City Council of Boulder. Sharon writes, "We are now proceeding with the template for an Ordinance/Resolution for CEDAW to utilize in any city getting this letter to participate in Cities for CEDAW". Further, our Legislative Committee has met with UNA-Denver and UNA BC (United Nations Association of Denver and United Nations Association of Boulder County).

- (3.) Equal pay for equal work. Women's Equality Day was held on August 26th. BPW Colorado members wore yellow to show solidarity at a BBQ held at the home of BPW Colorado's president, Nancy Litvak.
